

## Association's regulations

### Mark A: Membership

#### **Acceptance members**

1. (A) Founders of the Association are its members from the day of its registration.
- (B) A person willing to be a member of the Association will submit to the board the following request:

"I (name, address, ID) want to be a member of the (Association name) Association. I am familiar with the Association's goals and regulations. If I am accepted as a member, I pledge to uphold the regulations and accept the decisions of the Association's general assembly".
- (C) Accepting or refusing to admit a member into the Association is at the discretion of the committee, if the committee refused, the applicant can challenge the refusal prior to the next general assembly.

#### **Rights and obligation of a member**

2. (A) An Association member is entitled to participate and vote in every general assembly and will have one vote in every election; he is entitled to vote and be elected to the board or the audit committee.
- (B) An Association member is entitled to participate in the Association's activity and benefit from its services.
- (C) The board, with the approval of the general assembly, can determine member fees, which are obligatory for all members.
- (D) Membership expiration does not exempt from payments due to the Association from the member prior to expiration for the period of his membership.

#### **Membership expiration**

3. (A) Membership in the Association expires:
  - (1) Death of a member, and if a member is a corporation – when it is disassembled.
  - (2) Withdrawal from the Association; a written notice of withdrawal will be submitted to the board 30 days in advance.
  - (3) Upon removal from the Association.
- (B) The general assembly can, according to proposal by the committee, decide to remove a member from the Association for one of the following reasons:

- (1) The member has not paid his dues to the Association
  - (2) The member did not comply with the regulations or a resolution of the general assembly.
  - (3) The member acts contrary to the Association's goals.
  - (4) The member has been convicted with felony.
- (C) The committee will suggest to the board to remove a member from the Association only after giving the member an opportunity to state his claims before it and will not suggest according to the above (B) (1), (2) or (3) only after warning the member and providing him with adequate time to rectify the wrong.

#### **Providing notices to a member**

4. Invitation, demand, warning and other notice of the Association to a member will be provided in writing served personally or sent by regular mail to his address as registered in the members' book, the Association will change said address following a written request by the member.

#### **Mark B: General Assembly**

##### **Time and location**

5. The committee will determine date, hour and location of a general assembly.

##### **Invitation**

6. A general assembly will convene by a notice provided to each member ten days in advance and will note the day, time, location and schedule for the meeting.

##### **Roles of regular general assembly**

7. A regular general assembly will here reports on committee and audit committee activities, will discuss them and the financial report submitted by the committee, approve them and select the committee and audit committee.

##### **Quorum**

8. (A) A general assembly will not commence if there are less than 25% of the members; if the quorum is present at the beginning of the assembly, it may proceed in its deliberations and reach decisions even if the number of participants dwindle down.

##### **Chairman and secretary**

9. The general assembly will elect a chairman and secretary for the assembly from the Association's members.

### **Resolutions**

10. Resolutions of the general assembly will be reached by a majority of voters, unless the law or this regulation document demands a different majority; if the votes are even the chairman of the assembly may rule.

### **Protocol**

11. The secretary of the general assembly will manage the protocol.

### **Mark C: The Committee**

#### **Number of members**

12. The number of committee members will be determined at the general assembly resolution and will not be less than two.

#### **Tenure period**

12. (A) The board will be in office from the day of its election at the general assembly until another general assembly elects a new board; member of the old board can be elected to the new board.  
(B) A board member can resign at any time from his post by a written notice to the board; the member will cease to serve if declared lawfully invalid or bankrupt.

#### **Board completion**

14. (A) If a board member's place is vacated, the rest of the board members can appoint another Association member to serve on the board until the next general assembly; until such an appointment, the remaining member/s can continue to function as a board.  
(B) The board member unable to fulfill his roles, the remaining board member/s can appoint an Association member to replace him until he can resume his obligations.

#### **Board meetings**

15. The board can regulate its own meetings – the invitation, required quorum and Managing the meetings.

### **Resolutions**

16. The board resolutions will be reached by a majority of voters; if the votes are even, the resolution not accepted; a unanimous decision of all board members can be reached not at a board meeting.

**Protocol**

17. The board will manage a protocol of its meetings and resolutions.

**Representation right**

18. The board can authorize two or more of its members or position holders to sign documents on behalf of the Association, which will bind it and carry out in its name actions that are within its jurisdiction.

**Mark D: Audit Committee****Instructions inception**

19. Instructions of regulations 12 to 17 will apply; with required modifications, on the audit committee

**mark E: Branches****Forming and organizing branches**

20. The Association can, with the general assembly's decision, form branches and determine their organization and the way they are managed.

**Mark F: Assets after dismantlement****Transferring surplus assets**

21. If the Association is dismantled, and after paying its debts in full assets remain, these assets will be transferred to another Association with similar causes.
